ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 1. Application for admission must be made in the prescribed form supplied along with the Prospectus.
- 2. Admission is bassed on merit of individual student and is governed by College admission rules formulated for such purpose by the Admission Committee.
- 3. Admission to the College generally starts after declaration of the result of the qualifying examination.
- 4. The attested copies of the following documents are to be furnished along with filled up application forms.
 - a) Two copies of recent stamp size photographs.
 - b) Attested copies of Pass Certificate, Admit Card and Marksheet of the qualifying examination.
 - c) Character certificate (to be issued by authority of the academic institution last attended by the applicant).
 - d) Migration Certificate in original is essential for C.B.S.E/ICSE students and applicants from outside Assam.
 - e) SC/ST/OBC/MOBC physically challenged certificate, if applicable.
- 6. Every payment should be made at the College cash counter/digital payment.
- 7. Fee Card / Identity Card / Library Card, issued at the time of admission are to be preserved very carefully. Loss of any of these cards should be intimated to the College Office immediately and a duplicate card will be issued on payment of Rs. 50/- only per card.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION:

H. S. Course :- A candidate seeking admission into H. S. 1st year class must have passed H.S.L.C. Examination conducted by SEBA, Guwahati or any other equivalent examination, board recognized by the appropriate authorities. In addition, admission into the H. S. 1st year will be determined according to the guidelines set by the College Admission Committee.

UG Course: Candidates, willing to apply for admission into UG. 1st Semester class of Four year UG Course, must have passed Higher Secondary (10+2) or equivalent Examination from any recognised Board/Council.

N.B.:-

a) Additional/ Optional subjects at H. S. level will carry no extra benefit of marks, but will be treated as elective subject in case a student fails in any one of the elective subjects.

- b) More than one language subjects cannot be offered as "Elective".
- c) Advanced Bengali / Elective Bengali or Advanced Manipuri / Elective manipuri or Elective Hindi cannot be choosen as elective subject with Sanskrit.
- d) The decision of the Admission Committee regarding selection of subjects shall be final and binding.

CLASS SCHEDULE:

Academic Session of H.S. Class will tentatively begin from June and Continues till February of the next calendar.

Holidays are declared strictly in accordance with Assam University Rules of Holidays/Assam State Govt. Rules of Holidays.

A class of all courses (HS and FYUG & TDC) generally begins at 10.00 am and continues till 3.30 PM. from Monday to Saturday. Students are required to collect their class schedule just before the beginning of the first day of class. Class schedule of all classes is displayed on the College Notice Board/College Web.

ATTENDANCE:

Students of all classes are required to attend lectures of respective classes of specified duration. 75% attendance of lectures delivered in each subjects is compulsory for all students to be sent up for the Final Examination of University or Council.

OTHER FACILITIES

1. PRITAM BHATTACHARJEE MEMORIAL LIBRARY

The Library is well equipped with borrowing, reading and reference sections. Computerized accession and borrowing facilities is available. For further details students are advised to get in touch with the office of the Librarian.

- 2. **CANTEEN:** The College has a canteen which remains open during class hours and examination days throughout the year. The statutory canteen committee keeps vigil on the service quality, quantity of the edible staff and beverages sold in the canteen.
- 3. **BOYS' COMMON ROOM:** Boys' Common Room of the College has some in-door and recreational facilities. Both up-keep and improvement of the facilities therein are monitored by a teacher-in-charge.

AFFILIATION & RECOGNITION

MONMOHAN GHOSH ANIL DAS MEMORIAL COLLEGE has acquired Prior permission from the govt. of Assam vide No.PC/PR/67/2018/234 and Academic permission from A.H.S.E.C (ASSAM HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION COUNCIL, GUWAHATI) to start H.S. Arts and Commerce classes under No AHSEC/RPR/RPC/57/06/1810-1884.

SCHEME OF STUDIES

The academic aspects of the two-year Higher Secondary Course are governed by the rules and regulations of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. The Course is split into two years with two year-end examinations. Both HS First Year Examination and HS Final Year Examination will be conducted by the AHSEC.

FOUR YEAR UG PROGRAMME (FYUG)

AFFILIATION & RECOGNITION

The institution has also acquired Approval (NOC) from the government of Assam to start TDC Arts & Commerce Courses vide No.AHE.314/2018/81 & subsequently the College has also acquired Affiliation from Assam University, Silchar vide No AUD/C-78/2018/405

Further the College has acquired registration from All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) Code No. C-63732, under Ministry of Higher Education, Govt. of India.

SCHEME OF STUDIES

In order to implement NEP 2020 from the session 2023-24 UG courses in affiliated Colleges under Assam University, Silchar, the College offers courses as The Four Year UG Program (FYUG). Each program is split into eight semesters with eight semesters examinations. All the eight semester examinations are conducted by the University & the simple Degree is awarded after three years without any arrear paper, Honours with Research is awarded after four years. The students of Old Course could complete their Degree as per earlier announced CBCS (TDC) Program.

Admission to immediately next higher semester (II/III/IV/VI/VIII/VIII Semester) after each End Semester Examination (ESE) shall be mandatory for each and every student with or without "Arrear paper(s)". Such admission process starts after the completion of ESE and shall be completed well ahead of commencement of classes for the respective semester. Procedure including the Schedule of such admission shall be notified by the College in due time in NOTICE BOARD/College website i.e. www.mmgadcollege.ac.in

Guidelines for Four Year UG Programme (FYUG) under NEP 2020 from the session 2023-24

1. UG curriculum for colleges affiliated to Assam University shall be a four year UG programme (FYUG) as per curriculum structure provided in Annexure-1. Option for lateral exit shall be free from additional 04 credit earning. In lieu of Project/ Dissertation in VIII semester, students shall have option to take three additional courses as Discipline Specific Course which will be equal to 12 credits in total. However, students opting for project/dissertation will be given Honours with Research degree and students opting for additional three Discipline Specific courses in lieu of Project/Dissertation will be given Honours degree. It is decided that in their

respective prospectus each college should categorically mention this. It is also resolved that all those three papers (DSC-452.453 and 454) should be of level 500.

- 2. Interdisciplinary courses shall have 04 baskets viz: Natural Sciences (NS). Social Sciences (SS), Humanities (HN) and Commerce & Management (CM). Students may opt for any one from those 04 baskets in each of I. II and III semester.
- 3. From Discipline Specific Minor students shall take two subjects related to his her Discipline. Each such subject should of 50% of total credit allotted to this course. Viz; for Three Year UG programme each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 13 credits and for Four Year UG programme each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 17 credits. Assam University shall notify cluster of subjects from which Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) can be chosen. To be more precise it is decided that DSM- 101(3), DSM-201 (4), DSM-251(3) and DSM-301(3)-13 credits should be the first minor subjects in case of Three Year UG Programme (TYUG) and DSM-151 (63) DSM -252 (3), DSM-DSM-302 (3) and DSM-351(4)-13 should be second minor subject. For FYUG Programme DSM-401 (4) should be first minor subject and DSM -451(4) should be second minor subject.
- 4. Students securing highest CGPA (above 6.0) and with no back paper shall be allowed to change his/her core course once only, after completion of second semester. However, if a candidate desires to make one of his/her minors to core then automatic change in the minor should be done as same subject cannot be opted as both core and minor. Also change of core may be allowed only within allied subjects.
- 5. 7.5 CGPA should be obtained by a student up to 3 year for opting Honours with Research Degree in 4th year. However, for only Honours degree there shall not be any CGPA restriction. But students with arrear paper shall not be allowed to move to 4" year in any case.
- 6. Evaluation of 3 and 4 credit courses shall be out of 100 marks and that for 2 credit course shall be out of 50 marks.
- 7. IDC courses opted shall remain same for all three semesters. Semester wise change of IDC is not allowed.
- 8. For AFC courses, there shall not be any internal exam. Total Marks for AEC examination shall be 50 with two hours examination duration.
- 9. SEC shall have to be opted from either DSC or DSM. Evaluation method for SEC for Science stream shall be 50 (End Semester Theory) +30 (End Sem Practical/Project/Field work) + 20 (internal test of which 14 for test and 6 for attendance). The same for Arts and commerce shall be 50 (End Semester Theory)+20 (End Semester Practical/Project/Field work) +30 (internal test of which 20 for test and 10 for attendance)...
- 10. For EVS (VAC-151) evaluation method shall be 70 (End Semester exam) + 30 Internal/Assignment. Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
- 11. Evaluation method for VAC -101 (with practical) shall be same as that of SEC (with practical) and that of VAC-101 (Without practical) shall be same as VAC-151.
- 12. EVS in VAC-151 should be of 100 level and EVS included in Natural Science Basket as IDC should be of 200 level.

- 13. . Publication / Presentation of papers out of Research Project/ Dissertation carried out in VIII semester is not mandatory. However, the project shall have to be presented before Departmental Research Committee and in presence of an external examiner during end semester examination. Total marks for the project shall be 300 of which 90 shall be internal and 210 is for end semester examination. Out of 90 marks as internal. in case of Dissertation/Project, there shall be three progress reviews and each review shall be of 30 marks. Marks obtained by a student in each of the review shall be notified immediately. Review of progress shall be done by concerned supervisor in presence of Departmental Research Committee.
- 14. For all other courses evaluation method shall be of 70 marks (for End Semester Examination) and 30 marks (for Internal Examination). Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
- 15. Natural Science in IDC shall not have any practical component.
- 16. For Subjects with practical's DSC -152, DSC -253, DSC -303. DSC-354 and DSC- 404 shall be practical with 100 marks. Practical examination shall be held in presence of External Examiner..
- 17. For Subjects with practical DSM -251 shall be practical for first minor and DSM-351 shall be practical for second minor. Marks for practical examination shall be 100 each and examination shall be held in presence of External Examiner.
- 18. For VAC 151 (EVS), shall not have any practical component.
- 19. All DSM courses shall be stand alone and students can select first minor subject and second minor subject according to their choice keeping total requirement of 17 credit for each minor but they cannot change the code of minor papers, viz: One student of Physics (Core) may have Chemistry as first minor in DSM 101 and Mathematics as second minor in DSM 151. But the other student of Physics (core) may have Mathematics as first minor in DSM-101 and Chemistry as second minor in DSM 151.
- 20. For Research with Honours students, DSC-451 paper shall be research methodology and content of this course shall be same across the subjects and across the disciplines. However, for other students. DSC 451 will be a usual 500 level paper.
- 21. Any student interested to opt for Honours with Research should have 7.5 CGPA up to third year without any arrear.
- 22. In lieu of MIL, Alternative English may be opted by a student

Arrear Papers (S)

A paper of any course will be treated as "Arrear Paper" when a student "Failed to pass (F)/remained absent (AB)" in that paper of any ESE and in the Grade card shown as "Yet to pass: Paper Code". However, a student with more than 5 (five) "Arrear papers" of all previous semesters (First, Second, Third and Fourth semesters) shall NOT be allowed to appear in the 6th ESE. Marks Scored in CCA for which the student appears as an Arrear Paper shall be Carried over for declaring the result of concerned Arrear Paper as per Rule mentioned under 22.1.3. A student with an Arrear in any semester shall NOT be eligible for determining the Merit Positions/Ranking/Gold Medalist.

RE-CHECK

Re-Checking of Answerscripts of theory papers of any ESE to a maximum of three papers per semester may be allowed by the University to those candidates who have obtained Grades in concerned paper(s) above 3.5. In re-checking only posting and totaling of marks will be checked. Interested students may apply for re-checking in a prescribed format along with original Grade card and requisite fees within 15 days of

RE-EVALUATION

Re-evaluation of Answerscripts of theory paper of any ESE may be allowed by the University only on the condition that re-evaluated result shall be accepted by the student, even if the marks/Grade decreases after re-evaluation. A new Grade card containing re-evaluated marks cancelling the earlier one shall be issued by the University. Interested student may apply for re-evaluation of answer scripts of any ESE in prescribe format along with requisite fees and original copies of Grade card within 15 days of publication of results of the concerned ESE to the COE through the Principal of the College.

BETTERMENT EXAMINATION

A student may be allowed to appear in Betterment Examination in any 1 (one) theory paper per semester in which the student has secured Grade 4.00 and above and the student must appear the examination within the stipulated span of completion of his/her programme of study i.e. falls under 5 (Five) years at a stretch from the date of admission in the programme.
